Teaching Artists

Charles Baumgartner is a multi-instrumentalist performer, drum circle facilitator, instrument maker and private and group instructor of West African drums and Native American flutes. He is the founder of the Facebook group "Space Coast Drum and Dance". Charles participates in disability-related events throughout the Space Coast community including drum facilitating at The Studio at BAC and the annual BAC's Color in Motion Arts Festival at the Brevard Zoo. Charles earned an associate of science degree in music and video business from the Art Institute of Ft. Lauderdale. Charles demonstrates his passion for drumming and working with students and adults of all ability levels as evidenced on stage!

Chris Kahl is a musician who started performing in the late 1990's and, after graduating from Rollins College, he continued his musical journey in London for several years singing in the subways of the London Underground and performing numerous times on the BBC. Today, Chris works as an Artist in Residence in Central Florida schools, and travels around the state to perform at folk festivals. Chris enjoys singing about Florida's history and looks forward to carrying on the Florida troubadour tradition for years to come. Chris has also been a "regular" for the BAC Performing Arts Showcase and often teaches music for The Studio working with participants of the Adult Day Training Program at BAC in Rockledge.

Today, she owns Dance Variations in Rockledge and loves sharing her love of dance with children and families in the community. Andrea Smith is a former music educator, church musician, leaislative assistant, and event planner for various organizations. She played the piano and clarinet all through school and college, with piano being her major instrument studying for a Bachelor of Music Education and playing clarinet as a member of the Florida State University Marchina Chiefs. In her 21 year public teaching career with Brevard Public Schools Andrea taught 9 years of elementary general music which included chorus, strings, keyboards, percussion ensemble, and musical theater, and then taught 12 years of chorus, orchestra, and drama at the middle school level. Now, they are working for The Salvation Army Domestic Violence Program as a Youth Advocate.
